Typical Bunny Phone Call

Many times, the typical phone call from the public goes like this, "I found a nest of bunnies in the middle of my yard and the mom is nowhere around." the Mother bunny does not sit on her nest like a chicken. She stays away so that predators don't find her babies. She feeds them late at night and early in the morning. The best thing to do is give Mom the chance to care for her babies and let them leave the nest. They only spend a few weeks in the nest before they start to explore more and then are on their own by the age of 4-5 weeks. Please be patient with them and try to keep pets and children away. If you know that something happened to the mother, call WRT for help. If your friends or neighbors have removed the bunnies from the nest, have them put them back and let Mom do her job.
