SQUIRREL PHONE CALLS

Many times, the typical call from the public goes like this, "I found a baby squirrel at the base of my tree." When this occurs, depending on the weather, the best thing to do is give Mother Squirrel a chance to pick up her baby. Sometimes they will pick up their babies and take them back to the nest, but not always. Spring thunderstorms can be exciting, but also dangerous for squirrels - their nests and/or their trees can fall down and now they have no place to go. Mother Squirrel can make another nest in a different tree or a different part of the tree, if given the chance. If you find a baby squirrel on the ground, keep an eye on it for a couple hours and if Mother doesn't return, we need to get involved. Call WRT and we can help care for the squirrel.

SONGBIRD CALLS

Soon, we will be getting in baby birds. Spring storms can wreak havoc on their nests. If you find a baby bird on the ground that has no feathers, you can try to place it back in the nest.

Remember the 4 P's:

Find something PLASTIC (margarine tub, Cool Whip tub, ice cream bucket, flower pot).

POKE holes in the bottom for drainage.

Fill it with PAPER (paper towels, shredded newspaper or shredded paper).

PLACE the nest back in the bucket (if it's still together) and put the new nest back in the tree/bush where it came from. Remember to secure it - Nebraska is always windy!

When birds are older and have feathers and are hopping around the yard, they are fledging, which means their feathers are growing and their parents should still be caring for them. If they have feathers, leave them alone and let Mom and Dad Bird do their jobs.
